## "A New Way"

I don't need to tell you about what is new around St. Luke's. You've seen so much of it recently. Our new collaboration with the Lutheran Church of Our Saviour, which has been wonderful. I hope you shared in our combined Youth Sunday, with its great message, rap and drama! What a fantastic job these young folks did!

I hope you've been part of the new exercise class . . . or helped prepare for our Easter Egg Hunt in its new location at Rockwood Park . . . or appreciated the new postcard ministry offered by our Congregational Care Committee . . . or prayed for the new Neighborhood Watch organization, meeting at St. Luke's, to make our community safer . . . new . . . New . . . NEW!

What's so special about 'New', though? Why does newness excite us, whether it is a new and precious child, a new job, a new friend, a new \_\_\_\_\_ (you fill in the blank).

Don't we really love "new" because it brings us a sense of hope, a new starting point, new possibility, new understandings, even of ourselves? New is so inviting, because as we experience these things, we hope that their newness may just rub off on us--infuse us with a sense of new possibilities, energy, and fulfillment.

Isaiah reminds us that one of the most hopeful new things God can give us is a new, and unlikely, and unexpected way. In the ancient world, travel was precarious, and more often than not, travelers encountered not a way forward, but an obstacle to prevent their progress. In the Old Testament, God declares that He is giving his people a remarkable, unmistakable path forward. A way that is not only plain but also miraculous.

And as Lent nears the Glory of Easter, we overhear Jesus in the Gospel of John, telling Thomas, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life." (14:6) Here is a new way that humanity thought more unlikely than rivers in the desert or a road in the wilderness. Jesus is a way through death to life. Incomprehensible to even the human imagination, until one day at a cross . . . and then . . . three days later at the tomb. When we face death, when we face fear, when we mourn, Jesus promises to be the way "through" as well as "to." Follow Him, stand upon Him, walk only by his Grace, and find a journey you thought was impossible, and an ending to the journey that is way beyond just "Happy." For all eternity, we need more than happy—we need Glorious, and that is what Christ gives to us. A humble way in the dust of the earth, a humble way of service by our souls, that miraculous brings us not only to the most immovable obstacle—death—but even through it, to the Glory of Christ, Risen and Reigning.

May you know that you are following Him, that He is literally the ground beneath your feet as the way—and the Guide to see you arrive safely at your destination – as your Risen Savior! Might the path you walk be one of discipleship.

In your walk and on "the Way," may your find a new spring, not only in your step but also in your soul. May Easter bring you newness and renewing, for each of the steps that He has placed before you.


