THE FELLOWSHIP HALL CEILING RENOVATION began May 30th at 10 am! Three cheers for Wilmer, Ronnie and the whole crew! "Finish What You Start"

That's good advice, isn't it? I can remember hearing that sentiment when I was working on a hard project in school or when I had taken too many veggies on my plate. "Finish what you start." And generally in life, I have. I have certain impatience with loose ends. I like things tied up neat and tidy.

But to finish what is before us often takes time and determination, I'd say. For example, consider that shortly after I arrived in 2011, half the fellowship hall ceiling came loose from its moorings and lurched toward the floor. The Staff Parish committee held my welcome reception on one side of the Fellowship Hall while repairs were beginning on the other.

Our intention was always to get to the other half of the ceiling. But then improvements for fire code appeared, and the need for a permit. Building materials were stored far away from the ceiling for which they were intended, down in the basement. Months, and then years, went by as the Trustees sorted through the building codes, diagrams and plans, and pursued an engineer's stamp.

Now here we are in 2017, almost a full six years later, with lots of effort invested in planning, and even more now being invested in renovating; and the fellowship hall ceiling is on track to being completed! A fine cadre of retired men on ladders, and one mighty school teacher, too (Yea, Debbie!), are making improvements and putting our Fellowship Hall back together again, so that it is even better than before.

Tenacity, perseverance, teamwork, and faith . . . what a winning combination! And not only when it comes to ceilings!

We are asked to move another project toward completion, aren't we? The spread of the Gospel. And this takes innovation as well as renovation. Personal investment of thought, care, time and energy. It takes not being satisfied with what was, even though we are thankful for it, and seeking what is to be.

The theme for Annual Conference this year is "A New Thing!" Bishop Lewis wants the Virginia Conference to do a new thing. That means appreciating the past while we build for the future. It means enjoying the familiar while we dare to architect something novel.

St. Luke's, we have some of that newness here—and not just in the Fellowship Hall! We are new in reaching outside our walls and we are new in collaborating with our Lutheran neighbors, and we are new in getting involved with our Neighborhood Watch.

Will you watch for the new, welcome the new, give thanks for that which is new? Can you see the new being done to fulfill our promise to finish what we started as the church—to spread the Gospel to people and places that have not received it?
