For 9 women and 19 children (ranging from 1 to 14 years old), St Luke's UMC was their refuge and shelter from August 12th through 19th. Well, make that 11 women and 23 children! On August 19th two new families joined the program because of an emergency placement the last night St. Luke's hosted the Family Focus program of CARITAS.

The guests arrived hesitantly on Saturday evening, not sure what to expect, not knowing the congregation of St Luke's and the care and concern of not only our congregation, but also the participants of the Lutheran Church of Our Saviour and several other churches.

Each day, over 100 meals were organized and served to our guests and volunteers. Evening meals were prepared by the Youth Group, Prospector's and Pastor Lisa's Sunday School classes, Girl Scout Troop 5228, Boy Scout Troop 2874, St. Luke's Preschool, Young at Heart, Lois Callis Sunday School Class and St. Luke's UMM. We even enjoyed having some of the children offer the prayer before the evening meal. Lunches were graciously donated by LCOS. Breakfast items were donated by a host of hero volunteers.

In the evening, crews were comprised of a variety of volunteers who broke bread with the guests, helped tie shoes, led dance parties, and helped corral children at the laundromat or at the showers. We ventured to Ramsey UMC and St. Mark's UMC to utilize their shower facilities. Belmont UMC once again helped with our transportation needs. LCOS and VBS kindly provided all of the needed laundry supplies, detergent, dryer sheets and coins for use at the Coin Laundromat on Hull Street!


#### Mark your calendar for Saturday, October 14, 2017, 10:00am – 3:00 pm
