St. Luke's Charge Conference Presentation Oct. 1, 2017

Offered by Pastor Lisa Sykes, Mr. Bobbie Strum and Pastor Katie Pocalyko, our Guest from the Lutheran Church of Our Saviour.

Pastor Lisa:

On September 15th and 17th, Kathy Merry led St. Luke's Council in a visioning retreat. We affirmed that the DNA of St. Luke's contains a predominate genetic code of genuine friendship and missional concern for our community.

We are located in a stable community, with little demographic change in terms of race, age or income, but with the following identified challenges: poverty among children recently redistricted to Jacobs Road Elementary, grandparents serving as parents in addition to other non-traditional family structures, and a significant percentage of SBNR's. (People who identify as Spiritual But Not Religious)

Therefore, we will define disciple, in practical terms, by use of Matthew 11:

28 "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.29 Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. 30 For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." This scripture discloses to us that: A disciple recognizes Jesus as teacher;

accepts Jesus' yoke or personal "call" in their life,

and offers to share burden bearing and faith with others as a way of life.

Discipleship, like good works, is our response to the Good News of our salvation, and we offer it in reverent imitation of Christ who first loved us, and His outpouring love. Strengthened by the word, then, we will focus on building ourselves and others through service. (Bobbie Strum, Lay Leader)

While lifting our own loads with the help of the spiritual disciplines, we will seek to track our discipleship by how much we are able to lighten the load of those neighbors around us who struggle with their own loads/responsibilities.

Specific to the loads those in our community bear, we propose missional work that may include ideas such as: a family-friendly series of meals, which conclude with a short children's lesson; worship that is non traditional in form and time, such as a kid-friendly meal throughout Advent where scripture and carols can be shared by candlelight and where non-traditional families can feel comfortable entering in. Our goal is to teach children (and parents) the Gospel story in a popular Vacation Bible School format while welcoming them in a non-threatening way.

Discipleship through service will also include exploration of sponsoring a Stop Hunger Now-style program at the local elementary school, to package nutritious ready-to-boil meals for students and their families who are hungry. Such a program would involve school, business and church cooperation. Also, we imagine an event where we serve our homemade Brunswick stew at Jacobs Road Elementary for those students and their families with economic need.

The final, vital part of our discipleship is happening in concert with our Lutheran neighbors, through an experiment in cooperative ministry that just keeps growing. Here to speak about this is the Rev. Katie Pocalyko, pastor of the Lutheran Church of our Saviour, a neighborly congregation within walking distance of St. Luke's:

To illustrate the collaborative discipleship that is growing between our Lutheran and Methodist congregations, I thought immediately of that great, missional, cross-bearing, discipleship-laden text whose life lessons millions of parents have passed on to generations of children: If you Give a Mouse a Cookie.

Seeing that our collaboration started in 2015 . . . technically with cookies . . . when Lutheran Church of Our Saviour wasn't hosting CARITAS anymore and St. Luke's needed lunches for their newly-restarted CARITAS week, I present to you, "If You Give the Methodists Some Lunches":

If you give the Methodists some lunches for their CARITAS guests, you'll find yourself contemplating sharing Holy Week with them and celebrating Maundy Thursday and Good Friday together. And if you celebrate Holy Week with the Methodists, then you'll want to combine Youth Sunday School with them, which will lead to merging your Youth Group on Sunday aftenoons.

And if you merge Youth Groupsthen you'll unite Confirmation Classes and go to the ELCA's National Youth Gathering together. And if you plan to go to the Youth Gathering together, well then you may as well do Vacation Bible School together, which means you'll combine a summer worship service together (but not the offerings! - that's another story!) which will cause your Lutheran parents to ask (as of this week!) "Well, can we all do Sunday School together?"

So, as Jesus says, "Keep awake!"

If you give the Methodists some lunches And you'll find yourself, a Lutheran pastor, with the neighboring Methodist pastor and administrative assistant on speed dial, borrowing the UMC Book of Worship, locking up their church one Sunday afternoon, and growing more and more disciples for Jesus Christ, together.

blood, red cells, and plasma after the Las Vegas shooting, because it has shipped hundreds of pints to the hospitals there.

As those who would respond to this tragedy in faith and hope, please register to donate blood at **St. Luke's on Oct. 24 from 1 pm-6 pm and on Oct. 25 from 9:30 am-3:30 pm.** We invite church members, preschool parents, neighbors, and fellow congregations to uphold those far away by sharing in this effort so close to home.

St. Luke's invites you to go to www.redcrossblood.org and type into the blue search bar in the upper right corner stlukesgives. You will need to create an account with basic contact information, and then register to donate.

You can pick what kind of blood product you wish to donate and also what 15- minute time slot you want. Smaller framed persons should just sign up to donate "blood". If you sign up to give red cells called "Power Red" on the list, you need to be at least 5 foot 5 inches, and 150 pounds.

May these tragedies stop, and in the aftermath of this one, may we respond in faith! If you have any questions, just call St. Luke's at 276-7000.
