More Than the Sum of our parts

2 plus 2 is . . . 4 plus 4 is . . . 8 plus 8 is . . . I remember problems like this in grade school. There were set answers, and if you did your addition wrong (which I frequently did!), you got a great big red "X" on your worksheet. Mathematics is rather precise. There's a wrong and a right answer. Simple.

But what if 2 plus 2 is more than 4? And 4 plus 4, more than 8? Mathematicians might shake their heads in disdain, but theologians, well we are less certain and much more gracious. Why can't 2 plus 2 be more than four? After all, where 2 or more are gathered in my name, there I am in the midst of them. That means the mathematical answer is already off by one powerful 1!

Church life and Christian faith is all about the fact that we are more than the sum of our parts—more than meets the eye. As the church, the Holy Spirit unites us and strengthens us, so that who we are is more than the sum of our parts: we are the body of Christ; and what we can do is more than what our individual strength would accomplish (John 14:13).

It is Good News and a source of hope that God in Christ messes with worldly calculations. There is so much today that would make us just want to give up, size up the challenges against us, and call it a day. Thankfully, it is not that simple. God gets into the worldly calculus; God amplifies the hope to make a difference; God emboldens those who have too little to believe that even a mustard seed of faith can grow into the greatest of bushes.

We must judge neither on the outward appearance, the numerical calculation, nor the worldly estimation of life, for the spiritual resists quantification and the power of faith cannot be measured. Every Sunday we gather as a community of believers aware that through one small but wonderful church, God can do incredible spiritual things, including ministry, mission, and the transformation of the world, one disciple at a time.

As we await the future direction of our denomination, let us never forget the wonderful progress of our incarnate church, where 2 plus 2, is so much more than 4 . . . God bless you!

St Luke's will host 30 unaccompanied women as our guests to help provide shelter and comfort for our most vulnerable neighbors. Our guests will arrive at St. Luke's each night for dinner around 7:00 pm. They will participate in different events across the week and then spend the night in the fellowship hall before departing the next morning by 7:15 am. (Note: CARITAS just notified us that the women's group is the final pick-up in the morning and evening.)

A sign-up sheet is located on the hallway bulletin board and we are looking for volunteers for the evening shifts (welcoming and joining in a meal with our guests); the overnight teams (you work while you sleep!!). Just put out coffee and breakfast in the morning and hand over the pre-made lunches before the guests depart). Help is needed in setting up bedding on August 18 and taking bedding down on Aug 25. We also need some assistance during the week in tidying up the church during the day. Any groups wishing to provide meals should contact Chris Halloran and Karla Lacy to coordinate their preferred date and meal option.

A toiletry kit for each guest will be needed; and if anyone has spare magazines, books or movies that might be of interest to this group of women, along with any donations of women's clothing, those items would be greatly appreciated. We especially need INTERVIEW-TYPE CLOTHING. ANY SIZE IS WELCOME. PLEASE BRING TO CHURCH ON HANGERS.

Mats Matter— Six Month Progress Report

Ladies of the UMW enlisted the support of the congregation, pre-school, families, friends and neighbors six months ago to donate used grocers' plastic bags and join us in our Circle's 2018 Mission. As we related at that time, we felt led to repurpose these bags by crocheting them into safe and comfortable mats for homeless veterans.

Your immediate response to our plea for these bags was outstanding and, in addition, this request went viral when posted on our Facebook page! Thanks to all of you for the many ways you have supported and strengthened us throughout these past six months. We could not have accomplished such satisfying results without God's blessings and your help!

From the start, the number of bags donated was overwhelming and created anxiety as the realization kicked in that we needed many, many hands to collect bags, cut, create plarn (a new word-combination of plastic bag and yarn) and crochet 3' x 6' mats. Prayers were answered and God's blessings continued as we were able to enjoy fellowship as we worked; and soon we had plenty of bags, cutters, plarners and crocheters. This team effort resulted in 10 completed mats on April 4th.

Our excitement level was high as we hosted a luncheon for From the Heart and delivered our first batch of mats to their representatives that same day for distribution. An unexpected problem arose, however, when we learned from that original community service organization (and other service organizations) that because of a storage problem McGuire Hospital will accept no additional donations until winter! We needed to pick up 7 of the original mats that had not been placed since From the Heart's sources had withdrawn their assistance. While we thought we had problems when we needed people to crochet, we never thought for a moment our mats would have a problem finding a home of their own with a veteran!

Having learned about the mats from an on line American Legion newsletter, we contacted the American Legion Auxiliary Virginia State Office in Richmond for assistance. We were told to bring the mats there and they would try to place them in the right hands. We delivered them May 10th. On June 5th, I got the answer to another prayer when Yvonne Burgess of that office called to report that American Legion representatives had picked up all 7 mats, were thrilled about them and knew exactly where homeless veterans in the Richmond area could be found. Furthermore, they indicated that they would be happy to have as many as we can provide. In the meantime, we had completed another 10 mats that were taken to the American Legion Virginia State Office June 19th.

In closing, the above can be summarized by saying, "In the first six months of 2018, we have completed and delivered 20 mats to organizations around Richmond to be distributed to homeless veterans." This Mission has brought all of us at St. Luke's UMC closer together. We can boast that, with God's blessings and guidance, based on the premise forecast on line, it takes 700 plastic bags to complete one 3' x 6' mat. We produced 20 mats and share in the handling of 14,000 plastic bags. This Mission is our way to thank those men and women who gave so much of themselves to preserve our freedom and now have fallen on hard times.

Can I hear a resounding Amen?!


