"Help Wanted!"

IMAGINE:

Being 75 years old, using a walker, being sweet and cheerful . . . and homeless! Imagine being 30, very polite, the mother of 5 . . . and no way to contact your children but with a cell phone . . . and homeless!

Imagine being 43, determined to get out of poverty, impressive, driven, working two jobs . . . and homeless!

These descriptors are just a sampling of humankind who did not sleep on Richmond City streets because St. Luke's opened her doors to the CARITAS (Congregations Around Richmond Involved to Assure Shelter) program for one week in August. Women, 30 in number, who wanted help! Our help was wanted . . . and it was found right here!

There is no bigger hands-on mission project than CARITAS that we undertake as a Christian

community. To do so big a project, we really are a small church, but so able .

.. So, we put our own plea for help: "Help Wanted" to do the day-to-day day work of providing shelter. "Help wanted" in willing hands and caring hearts to do the work of CARITAS.

For four years, Dave and Laurie Hay, naturals at this kind of work, have led our whole-church team. The Kingdom hung out a "Help Wanted" sign and they responded! So did Chris Halloran and Karla Lacy, who move the mountain of organizing breakfast and dinner meals, and a thousand other little incidentals, during the week. These were our fearless and talented leaders, but who else responded on Team St. Luke?

Our towel washers, our over-night-ers, our clean-up crews, our early evening coordinators, our worship leaders, our laundry leaders, and our shower chauffeurs. WOW! Help WANTED, and help FOUND! Almost the entire congregation responded, not to answer an ad in the paper, but rather to offer an invitation to these women, into the Community of the Faithful and the Kingdom of God.

What will it be in the lives of these women, for them to look back on this time of struggle in their lives, and know the experience of us, responding in the Name of Jesus Christ, to their need? While we were answering these women's

requests for "Help Wanted," for another cup of coffee or a "new" interview outfit provided by the Powhatan Charity, Agape's Closet, the real and first "Help Wanted" request was advertised by our Savior, seeking disciples who would understand his teaching and follow his example, and welcome in the stranger.

I am so grateful as a pastor to have a church with a spirit that would safeguard and shelter persons such as these we came to know this week. We have a great team, and have a standing commitment already for next year, to do the same again. With our CARITAS captains, Dave and Laurie, retiring from this position after four exceptional years of service (THANK YOU!!!), it is time for St. Luke's to hang out the "HELP WANTED" sign again.
