Current committee undertaking: Review present endowment investments as to performance and conformity to church principles as stated in the Book of Discipline, the church Social Principles and the Endowment Charter

The committee met for the second time on 3/19/19 with Mr. Tommy Herndon, vice president, Legacy Giving & Stewardship Development for the Virginia United Methodist Foundation to discuss the services and investments offered by the Virginia United Methodist Foundation.

There are actually two branches of the organization. The Foundation primarily serves the church and the Virginia United Methodist Development Co. serves individual congregations members, by offering competitive investment certificates rates for individuals.

All investments offered to the church or congregation members meet the Social Principles and Book of Discipline requirements.

The funds available to the church are equivalent in their structure to most funds available through other investment firms.

The funds are stock funds, bond funds and balanced funds; the balanced funds have been returning an average of seven percent.

The funds are actively managed by Merrill Lynch at a reasonable management fee.


The organization offers an abundance of investment and management advice and service through their representatives.

The committee now needs to discuss and compare the data presented by both Ameriprise and the Virginia United Methodist Foundation in order to make any decisions on the investments of the Endowment Fund. The committee will meet again on April 30th to review and discuss the way forward.

St. Luke's United Methodist Women Stamps for Mission

We are calling all upon all of you to help us collect used stamps. If you will, please save all stamps that come in your mail to benefit missions. All stamps are useful. We will even take stamps that have not been used, as well as those that have not been cancelled, and both foreign and old ones. Below are requirements for the stamps.

- 1. Trim paper around the stamps at least a quarter of an inch around the stamps, or you can turn in the whole envelope.
- 2. If you have postcards, turn in the whole card.
- 3. Leave rows of stamps intact.
- 4. Give them to a member of the United Methodist Women and we will see that they are sent to our UMW coordinator.


Text Giving

Text Giving has come to St. Luke's!! Elestronic giving, in the form of texting on your cell phone, is now available to St. Luke's congregation and visitors (especially participants in our seasonal Binble School Programs). St. Luke's phone number for Text Giving is 804-476-2723. This phone number will be shown on your weekly bulletin as well as posted on the bulletin board just outside the Sanctuary. Attached is a diagram showing how to accomplish this option for your contributionsThe first time you text your funds, you will beasked a few questions to set up your account. After that, you only need to enter the sollar value of your gift. Giving must be done using your credit card. You will receive a receipt showing your transaction.











You will receive a registration link. Click the link and enter your contact and payment information. Tap "Process."
