When he had said this, Jesus called in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out, his hands and feet wrapped with strips of linen, and a cloth around his face. Jesus said to them, "Take off the grave clothes and let him go." John 11:43-44

Christ's Gifts: Restoration AND Resurrection

In the Gospel of John, it is clear Jesus would give us life, in this world and the next. Abundant life now and eternal life to come, no matter the cost. Just consider his miracle of raising Lazarus.

Raising Lazarus from the dead not only raised our Lord's fame among the people but also it raised the odds that Jesus would go to the Cross. He does it anyway.

By invitation of Jesus Christ, Lazarus himself, Lazarus the dead man, walks out of his tomb, before those who have come to his funeral, alive!

Now friends, the great prize we await is heavenly, not earthly. Resurrection to eternal life, not a return to earthly life is the Easter triumph. And yet in this pandemic, it is the lesser prize, the restoration of finite human life in the person of Lazarus, that speaks especially to me.

For what effort must it have taken for Lazarus to come out of his tomb. And in the same way, what strength will it take for us to exit the confinement of the past year for us? Has it not been something of a tomb for us? Isolation. Surrender. Fear. Ambiguity. Boundaries everywhere. A dark night for our souls.

This Easter, I want to know if you can do what Lazarus did—if you can summon the strength to leave any dark place where you have been dwelling this pandemic and walk into the brightness of a new day?

Can your soul begin summon the strength to embrace long lost concepts of joy, confidence, rescue, and renewal, not in the perfect world to come but rather right here-and-now, amidst this pandemic stricken one?

We Christians, dare not die to life, if we are to proclaim Jesus' promise of life after death!

Let us seek life in all its fullness, and the Lord who would restore us to it, not only in the world to come, but here, and especially now!
