It is not in our anger and frustration at this world and its tragedies, but in our trusting God’s Word, that we may humbly, meekly find our way forward in troubled times.

Victor Frankl, a neurologist, psychiatrist, philosopher and author, knew another time when the world was tragic. Frankl, you see, survived the Holocaust—and in a world he could not change, he came to a powerful conviction, and it is this: Says Frankl, “When we are no longer able to change a situation, we are challenged to change ourselves.” His sentiment fits so well with the themes of James 1.

In these unpredictable, uncontrollable times, which we cannot change, we are challenged to change ourselves . . . to find a new or renewed sense of peace from within—to discover in God’s Word new strength for the challenges we face—

to practice a new form of service for the good of others and the wellbeing of our own souls too.

Take James’ advice on these too-troubled-times:

“But be doers of the word, and not merely hearers . . . those who look into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and persevere, being not hearers who forget but doers who act—they will be blessed in their doing.”

Our world, friends, is chaotic. There is every reason to feel sorrow or anger.

But our God has given us his word to get us through our spiritual struggle and bring us to a new understanding of ourselves in the midst of a chaotic world.

So amid times we feel powerless to change, let us find the power to change ourselves instead, inviting the indwelling gift of God’s word to make us new.

As a United Methodist church, you probably have students within your congregation who are struggling with college costs, particularly coming out of the pandemic. We would like to help.

We can offer a fixed-rate educational line-of-credit (LOC) to your United Methodist students called **SnapLoan**. It's used by many as 'gap' funding after more traditional financial resources have been exhausted.

The rate on **SnapLoan** is very low (just **4.45%** at Methodist schools and **4.95%** at others), and students may qualify for a line-of-credit of up to \$40,000 to use over their academic career. And since no FAFSA is required, it's a good fit for those who might not qualify for other student loans.

Also note that the money can also be used for more 'non-traditional' education expenses like off-campus housing, books, study abroad, technology, and travel - even seminary!

We can make **SnapLoan** available to **ANY** student in connection with your ministry.

How Snaploan Works

- 1 Be a TUMCU Member.**
If you are not already a TUMCU Member, don't worry, it's free and easy to do. Apply for membership at tumcu.org/join/
- 2 Identify Your Funding Gap.**
Estimate the extra funds you'll need after you've used all your other resources. Based on that, you can request a line of credit up to \$40,000.
- 3 Apply For a Snaploan.**
You can apply at tumcu.org/snaploan. No FAFSA is required. And of course, there are no fees for application, origination, or prepayment. Note that approval may be contingent upon having a creditworthy guarantor for your line-of-credit.
- 4 Request funds as needed right on our website.**
We'll disburse the funds however you direct - for tuition, fees, room & board, transportation, rent, technology, study abroad, or any educationally-related expense.
- 5 No payments required during school and up to one year after (the In-School Phase).**
You must remain at least a half-time student, or you will be considered having left school. Your Snaploan line-of-credit interest rate will remain fixed during this phase. We always recommend making interest payments, if possible, to reduce the size of your loan upon leaving school.
- 6 Begin Repayment (the Post-School Phase).**
One year after graduation or otherwise leaving school, you start repaying your loan monthly. You can choose the term (up to 10 years), and a new fixed rate will be determined by formula, using the corresponding U.S. Treasury rate +4.0%.

How is Snaploan Different?

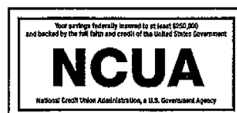
-  Snaploan provides access to funds that can be drawn whenever they're needed (and never more than you need).
