The Waiting Time

They fed the hungry, clothed the naked, visited the prisons, proclaimed the gospel and befriended the outcast. In this response to the time in-between, they give us a model for what we should be about, as we wait for what is yet to be, but not yet.

It will be a joyous time when things do return to normal, just as it will be a joyous time when our Lord returns to this world. But in the meantime, our hands and our hearts should be busy. It is a hopeful sign to see our small groups beginning again: United Methodist Men, the quilters, the United Methodist Women, Girl Scouts and ministry teams. There is even hope that we may have a stew before the weather turns too cold!

I only realize how much I have truly missed things when I am able to see them renewed in my life. The church meeting that was quite ordinary before the pandemic is quite extraordinary now, and I delight to see faces and people in 3D. It is a special occasion each time I get reacquainted with each of you in person. And so, as I begin to sense that an end to our in-between time of this pandemic is nearing a close, I hope and pray. For each piece of normalcy that returns, I give God thanks and celebrate the little things in life that I've come to appreciate that are really amazing!

This season as the leaves change, may you delight in the return of the colors and the chill of the season that causes you to pull out that old favorite sweater. And though there still may be some winter ahead, we know the in-between times will not last forever because our Lord gives us hope of a return to normal and, in the coming season of Advent, the return of his Kingdom to our hearts. Abide in faith a little while longer, my friends, and fill your time spent waiting with the Lord's work.


