# Immeasurable!

When I was little, the presents under the Christmas tree that got the most attention from me were the biggest ones. I remember stretching my arms open wide around big boxes wrapped in lovely paper with my name and a bow on top. I was always amazed by such big boxes, and even more, by their contents. Inside I would find a prized toy, one I thought too big to hope for . . . Over the years, these big gifts included dollhouses, ride-on ponies and a bicycle, just to name a few. You never forget having received those really big gifts, even when you grow older.

What you realize though, as you mature, is that the size of the gift can't always be measured in inches and feet. In fact, some of the greatest gifts are not only small in size (consider the box that contains a wedding ring) but even intangible—incapable of being boxed or wrapped.

Take for example, the gift you as the congregation of St Luke's, have given to me in the form of four and a half months of renewal leave. There is no measuring the size of this gift, my friends. It is such an extravagant gift that I would not usually even think to ask you for it. But two years of pandemic, with all its twists and turns for the church, and my family's need to find my son Wesley, who has autism, a home of his own (a slow and painstaking endeavor), and the experience of having COVID as a family a year ago, and the frustration of tremors in both my hands, and the push-and-pull of 32 years of ministry, I knew I had to ask for a gift from you, one so large that I would never have dreamed of asking for it before all of these things happened. Your response to my request has been so Christ-like. You have spoken not one begrudging word to me as I have pursued spiritual renewal leave, but instead, have affirmed this conference-endorsed time off for spiritual retreat and rest; and in addition, you've showered me with cards, thoughts and prayers.

I am better off for being St. Luke's pastor, and my family and I will never forget your extreme, extravagant and abundant generosity, and love and care shown in such a tangible way. It's bigger than any box you will ever find. Its dimensions are heaven-sent so that we may experience by such acts of kindness

My family and I give you heartfelt thanks, and I am especially grateful for the immeasurable way this lovely congregation ministers to its minister and the great, great gift you have given to me.




