One of my favorite memories is taking my three young sons and my mom to Maymont, one of Richmond's great treasures. I am especially fond of the beauty and peace of the Japanese Garden there. It was always so much fun when we came to the edge of the pond and the boys saw the stepping stones. Adam would take Seth's hand, Wesley would take mine, and Joshua would take Granna's. And together, we bravely sought to land our feet on the stepping stones, lest we join the Koi fish in the water.

The stepping stones were security, as we found our way through an adventurous path. Each time we returned to this garden, we found that the stepping stones had become old friends over time. The more we traced our steps there, the more we trusted the stones to guide us. I hadn't realized how much it would strengthen me and renew my spirit to reconnect with these dear friends. They are touchstones in my life. No matter how many years between our visits, the friendships remain steady and strong and do not change; like those old stepping stones that I'm so familiar with, they give me a toehold on this crazy world of ours, and remind me how important it is that we renew ourselves, body and spirit.

There are other touchstones I've come to share with you. A Christmas celebration to include candlelight Christmas, Brown Bag Nativity, and the Men's Club Christmas dinner. And of course there is our Youth dinner and show, which took us around the world this year, and yet gave us a sense of home. I hope you have, or that you will find, touchstones in your own life and in our life together.

## From the Finance Committee Thank You!

Your generous giving to the glory of God has seen St. Luke's through a challenging year of rising costs and unexpected expenditures. At the beginning of 2022 the church was faced with a heat pump compressor failure and a major roof leak had to be repaired. In the summer another heat pump failed and several dead trees required removal. The budget was strained mightily.

BUT through your tithes and offerings, contributions from the Preschool and generous year-end giving, we have successfully weathered our financial storms.

In addition, the Finance Committee is pleased to report that despite the year's financial challenges, St. Luke's paid a total of \$16,848 toward its apportionments to the Conference and District to support our global church. These funds were allocated as follows: \$15,072 - Active Clergy Health (100% of assessment), \$96 - Africa University (100%) and \$1,680.00 - District Administration (100%).
