60 years old is a good time not only to look back, but also to look forward. To give thanks for the faithfulness of years gone by, and to seek a new vision to carry us 60 more years into the future. There are seeds being planted right now, that will help us in that vision and its pursuit.

I feel as though St. Luke's has been given an anniversary present, one that was most unexpected. You all well know how vibrant and well regarded our preschool program is. Sadly, once the children complete Jr. Kindergarten, their ties often shift to other locations since we have not had a continuing ministry for them.

One of our preschool moms came to me, and said, "I'm not ready to be done with St. Luke's yet," even though both her children had graduated from the preschool. And so, she made a request that really is a gift to our church and its ministry. A home-schooling parent, she asked permission to use the church fellowship hall and adjacent areas on two

Friday mornings a month, so that homeschooling families in her neighborhood, and in the preschool, can meet here at St. Luke's as a home-schooling co-op, for enrichment, community and learning with a Christian framework.

I want you all to imagine the fellowship hall full of young families, learning and growing in knowledge and faith. Nothing could be more compatible with the gospel and with our hopes for ministry in this place. Now that summer Vacation Bible School has been a wonderful success, post pandemic, and as we seek to

restart Wednesday Night Bible School, I see a vision for St. Luke's as a church in ministry to God's children of all ages, with a new ministry, or should I say renewed ministry, to young families with young children. All of this grows out of seeds planted generations ago by other mothers who wanted a morning out program, one that developed into the best preschool in Richmond.

> We seek to be a ministry as a congregation of Jesus Christ to the family of God, where we are all children of God, and pass the gospel in new ways to the new generations that follow. May the next 60 years be full of promise here, to the children of God who are grown and even crowned with grey, as well as to the children who are little and have yet to learn all the lessons that we have been taught by and about our Savior.

May we learn them anew, right along with those who are new to us.

Update on Maui Wildfires

Please continue to pray and stay updated on the wind-driven wildfires on Maui that have prompted evacuations and caused significant loss of life and widespread damage.

As of an August 14 update, UMCOR is coordinating with the California-Pacific Annual Conference to process an initial grant for emergency supplies such as shelf-stable food, water, hygiene items and tools to help survivors recover belongings as first responders continue to provide initial aid in the area.
